A Note from Tom

Yesterday, I travelled up to Grace Episcopal Church in Standish with Holly, Rayna, and Father Don Davidson for the official closing of the church. It was a somber, at times tear-jerking service for what was a 100-year-old church in the heart of downtown Standish. The church closed due to a lack of leadership, a terrible flood, and some other circumstances.



In my mind, the church closing echoed the importance of committed leadership at both the church and *diocesan* levels. I couldn't help thinking that perhaps this closing could have been avoided had we had a diocesan bishop in place. But it has been nine years now since Bishop Todd Ousley departed our diocese. For the churches of the former Diocese of Eastern Michigan, the last nine years have been a long journey.

But we now have four candidates for bishop, one of whom will be elected at convention this October. Their names are Terri Bays, Zachary Nyein, Holly Rankin Zaher, and Nurya Love Parish. Please pray for them.

And on **Friday, September 25, at 3:00**, St. Paul's will be hosting a "Meet and Greet" event for the candidates. It will likely be a well-attended event and we will need several volunteers to assist as greeters, and to do light refreshments. It should be an exciting day for St. Paul's, and a great opportunity to meet and get to know our potential future bishops.

We will get a sign-up sheet prepared and placed in the Welcome Center. Please consider attending, meeting our candidates, and lending a hand with the event.

1. All people that on Earth do dwell, Sing to the Lord with cheerful voice;

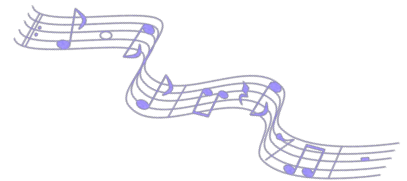
Him serve with fear, his praise forthtell; Come ye before him and rejoice.

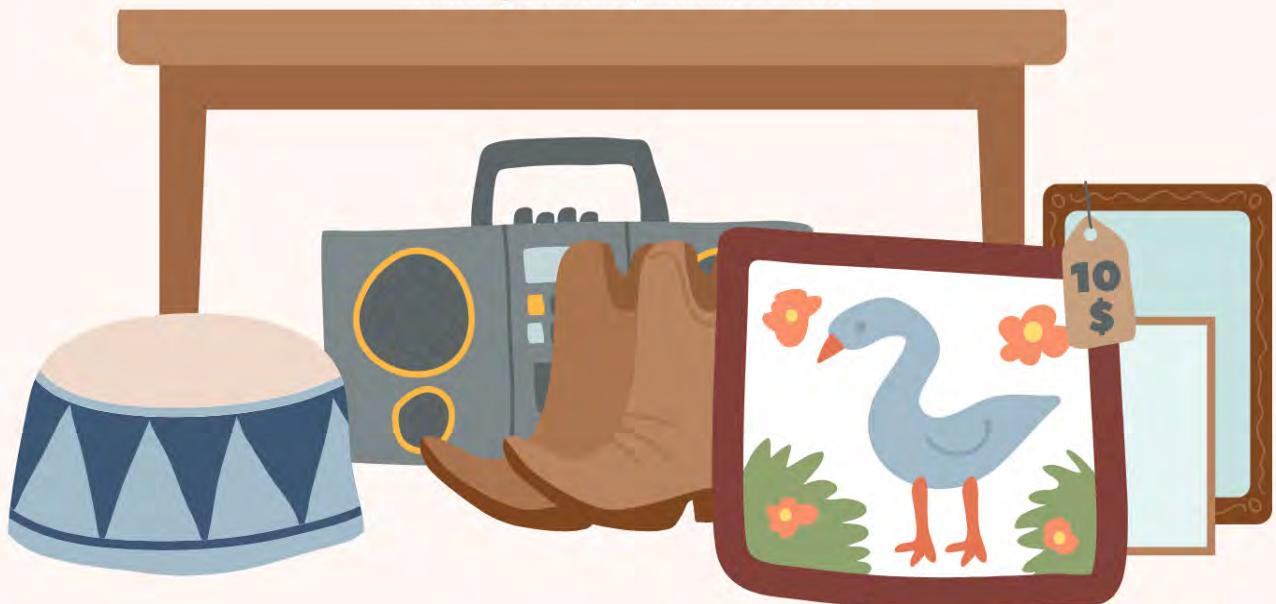

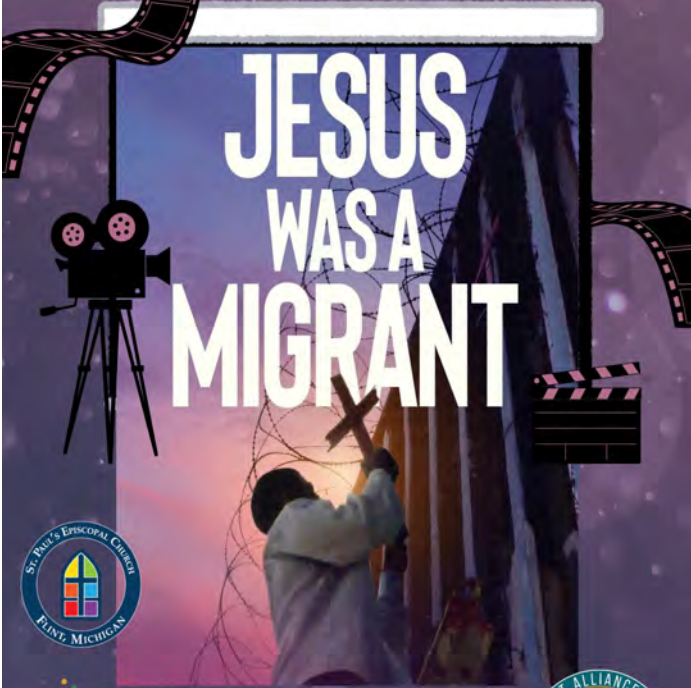

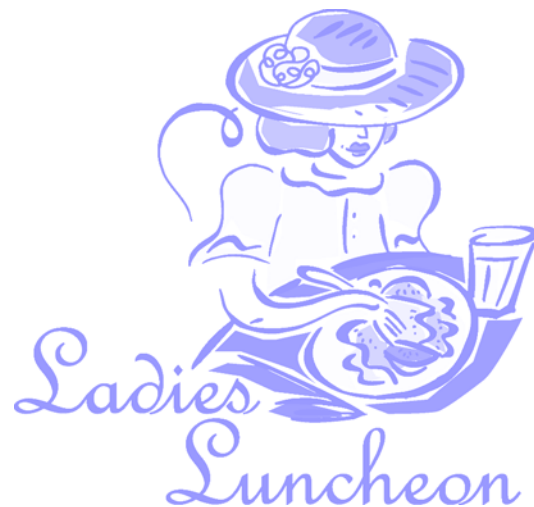
